Background: Dr. Joel Laudenbach received his DMD from the University of Pennsylvania, School of Dental Medicine in 1998. He completed residencies in general practice (Cedars-Sinai Medical Center - 1999), oral medicine and geriatrics (University of Pennsylvania - 2004). He is a published author on oral medicine related topics. Dr. Laudenbach is a faculty member in the Section of Oral Medicine & Orofacial Pain at the UCLA School of Dentistry. He is an attending on the medical staff at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center. Dr. Laudenbach maintains a private oral medicine practice in Beverly Hills and Tarzana, California.

Overview: "Lumps, Bumps, Lesions and Xerostomia"
The oral cancer screening examination technique will be reviewed in detail, including the necessary armamentarium and important locations for visualization/palpation. Common oral lesions observed in dental practice will be presented. Attendees will learn to recognize when additional testing and/or specialty referrals are indicated. Adjunctive and biopsy techniques will be reviewed including: tissue reflectance, tissue fluorescence, toluidine blue dye, cytology (i.e., smear and brush cytology) and conventional scalpel biopsy. Oral lesion management strategies will be discussed throughout the presentation. Xerostomia and salivary gland dysfunction can directly affect and alter treatment planning in dental practice every day. These clinical signs can also represent medical/systemic disease(s) and/or medication side effects. Clinical examination for salivary gland dysfunction, appropriate chair-side tests, medical/serologic tests, referrals and management will be reviewed.

"Oral appliance therapy and obstructive sleep apnea/snoring"
The history and clinical concepts of oral appliance therapy

(OAT) for the management of obstructive sleep apnea (OSA) and snoring will be presented. Current guidelines, indications, contraindications, side effects, clinical examination protocol and several available appliances will be reviewed. This lecture provides an introduction to sleep disordered breathing and oral appliance therapy.

“Dental management of medically complex/older adults”

Dental management of medically complex older adults will be discussed. Attendees will become familiar with techniques that help oral health providers to medically assess and safely treat older dental patients in private practice. The impact and dental management of pharmacotherapeutics in older adults will be reviewed throughout the presentation.
